BEGINNINGS

To find the beginnings our club we have to go back to our one-time neighbours, Oxford United!!

The inauguration of Headington United Football Club was in 1893. The founders, Rev Scott Tucker, Vicar, and Doctor Hitchings were seriously committed to providing healthy exercise for young men in the Headington district. However the first match was played in Headington Quarry and only in 1925 the Club moved to the Manor. The pitch was called Mattock's Field where roses were previously grown by the famous rose-growing family.

In 1924 public spirited shopkeepers led by Robert Wylie bought the Ground, as a sports field and placed a covenant on it to keep it as an open field for ever and formed Headington Sports Ground Ltd to manage the football, cricket, tennis and bowls clubs. The cricket and football clubs shared the ground with the cricket club, having use of it in the summer, and the football club in the winter, with obvious ensuing problems. In 1960 the football club became Oxford United.



Only the Bowls Club remains. In 2001 when approaches were made to the limited company to buy the whole site, lock, stock and barrel these were repulsed. Our committee re-acted very strongly to any purchase of this covenant so remarkably the Club remains and Headington Bowls Club is owned by the members (with certain restrictions). A large part of the site was sold in 2001, and is now The Manor Hospital, a sad end to the dreams of the original founders of a great local, fit community.

THE CLUB NOW

Our club has 120 members, plays over sixty matches home and away per summer season, has a very successful mens' A and B league team, and enthusiastic short mat evenings during the winter months. In both summer and winter months members can turn up on a Wednesday afternoon to enjoy a lighthearted 'roll up'. The Mens' League A team has had a very satisfying season, winning the A league trophy, well done!!

There is something for everyone in our Bowls Club. Would-be players can turn up at the Club to try out this fascinating game. Equipment can be borrowed for a short period of time. BABY DRUER All you need is one killer track.

MOVIE REVIEW BY OSCAR DUXFIELD

B aby driver is a film written and directed by Edgar Wright. It came out last year and is about a get-away driver for a bank robber named "Baby" who listens to music to keep himself focused and moving while at the same time drown out his tinnitus left over from a childhood accident. The directing is by far the most notable part of this film. Every scene is centred on the music playing from Baby's IPod, the result being that all the movement in the movie, from people walking to cars crashing, is in beat with whatever song is playing in that scene. This incredibly ambitious concept has been executed perfectly by Edgar Wright.

The music is non-stop throughout the film but it isn't so overpowering as to take away from the acting or detract from the plot. Edgar Wright was at the perfect point in his career to take this film on having recently directed the "Cornetto" Trilogy, giving him the experience to be able to pull off such an elaborate concept whilst still being young enough to want to take the risk that it might not pay off.

My only problem with this film are the female characters who seem only to exist in relation to their male counterparts needs. The romance between Baby and Debora feels rushed which it wouldn't if Debora's character had been fleshed out more so we could understand her motivations and personality. That said, I still loved Lilly James's performance as Debora as while the relationship between her and Baby felt rushed she still brought significant range to her character. There are some other great performances too. John Hamm plays "Buddy" excellently as does Jamie Foxx ("Bats"). The nervous dynamic Foxx manages to achieve while around every other character is brilliant leaving the audience on edge during all his scenes and unable to predict how he will behave.

Costume design was also prominent in this film. Every character is colour coded in each scene and keeps to the same few colours throughout. This small detail makes it easier to follow characters during the action scenes but, more importantly, subtly reveals traits of each of them before we get to know them fully allowing for faster character development. The film is full of other tiny moments too, that you'd easily miss on your first watch such as Baby quoting lines from films we see him watch at the beginning.

Overall baby driver is an excellently made film that you won't only appreciate for the intelligent movie it is but also for the fantastic amount of fun it is to watch, from the action to the dialogue your bound to be entertained for every one of its 113 minutes.

Worldwide Pinhole Photography Day takes place on Sunday 29th April.



With the advent of the smart phone we have happily turned into a nation of photographers, capturing images wherever and whenever we please. We add filters and create digital art so easily that we've almost forgotten a world where this wasn't possible... where photography was more of a dark art. Worldwide Pinhole Photography Day aims to get us back in touch with that magic.

Pinhole photography is photography without a lens. We know that people have been making images using pinholes since the 5th century AD because references to the process have been found in ancient Chinese texts. They knew that objects reflect light in straight lines and that rays from the top of an object, travelling through a pinhole, will appear in the lower half of an image...in other words the image will be upside down.

Greek philosophers and Arabian physicists studied the phenomenon. It was used in astronomy to study the movement of planets and solar eclipses while artists used it to help them paint landscapes.

Sir David Brewster, a Scottish scientist, was one of the first to make pinhole photographs in the 1850s. Photographs taken with a lens can be rendered very sharp: by contrast pinhole photos are soft. Some photographers liked them because they felt the images were atmospheric, not unlike the paintings of the Impressionists from the same era.

Nowadays the pinhole camera is still popular. It is another tool at a photographer's disposal. Like any tool it has advantages and limitations.

One big advantage is that a pinhole camera is very easy to make. It's basically a light box, with a tiny hole in one end and film or photographic paper in the other. Designing and building your own camera is great fun and taking pictures with it is a very satisfying and pleasurable experience. There are helpful videos on You Tube and even ready-made pinhole camera kits.

Pinhole cameras can - and have been - made from almost anything: drinks cans, cereal boxes, biscuit tins, shells and even an old refrigerator. A cardboard kit is probably the best material for a beginner, but the only limit is your imagination.

Photographic paper and developing fluids can be purchased very cheaply from camera shops and some good art retailers.

Declutter Your Life

It's that time of year when we get the urge to Spring Clean



If you can't lay your hands on items you need because they're buried under piles of junk; if you're constantly moving items from one pile to a new 'temporary' pile; if you find yourself thinking, "I can't throw this away, it might come in useful one day," you're probably a clutter-victim.

Californian blogger Dave Bruno wrote *The 100 Thing Challenge*. He set himself a year-long experimental task of reducing his belongings to 100 items. Although it started as a challenge he actually chose to keep living by his new rules afterwards, saying he prefers the simplicity.

It would be tough for most of us to emulate Bruno exactly, but he has a point. Most of us probably put far too much time, effort and money into acquiring, keeping and storing possessions, and sometimes it's good to let go.

If you're ready to de-clutter, then we have a few simple tips. If you feel you need help, there are experts in de-cluttering who will guide you through the process of letting go.

De-cluttering Tips

Deal with one room at a time the task will seem less daunting. Stick with that room until it's finished. Choose a nice day - Take the room contents outside. Psychologically it's easier to sort and let go if you're one step removed. It's also less likely that the clutter will make it back inside.

Sort everything into three piles -Label them dump, donate and keep. Be realistic: if the item in question hasn't been used for over a year it is unlikely you will ever use it.

Deal with the dump and donate piles - Do this before anything comes back into the house. It's much harder to mess up your good work if the stuff is physically gone.

Sort and label - Place the remaining items in clearly labelled boxes. Make sure there is one temporary box to house items which really belong in another room. As each room is sorted those items can be replaced, and other misplaced items can be housed there while the de-cluttering process continues.

Replace everything that remains - The maxim 'A place for everything and everything in its place' is a good one. Keep small items in clear plastic boxes and store them in cupboards or wardrobes.

When you're done instigate a 'one thing in: one thing out' rule. It will make you think twice about acquiring something if you know something else must go.

Finally, once a week, take two bags and go through your home. One bag is for rubbish, the other for items in the wrong place. When you've finished throw the rubbish away and replace the misplaced items.

Follow these small steps and you too can de-clutter your life.




