

LET'S MAKE IT A MERRY CHRISTMAS

A 2-0 defeat in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy to Cheltenham left us angry. But our determination couldn't give us a win against either Southend or Exeter. Both games finished 1-1 with goals from Danny Hylton and Callum O'Dowda (his first goal in senior football).

The Yellows then returned to home and returned to winning ways against Accrington. Danny Hylton, Michael Collins and Tyrone Barnett were all on target as we secured a convincing 3-1 victory. This form wasn't to last however as the following two games resulted in an undeserved 0-0 draw to Stevenage and a 2-0 loss to Luton.

Our unpredictable form left fans questioning whether or not we could win even the "easiest of games" against newly promoted teams. A home win to Newport gave fans confidence in the team again after Michael Collins amazing bounced free kick. Although, the faith in the team was knocked

right back down after a heavy and embarrassing 5-1 defeat to rivals Cambridge. To make matters worse, this game was broadcast live on Sky Sports for the country to see. Rumours have it that as punishment, U's boss Michael Appleton made his team watch the whole recorded match together to see their performance. Harsh.

Oxford then had the challenge of facing newly relegated Tranmere and, at the time, were the only team below Oxford in the table. Oxford put on their brave faces again to see off a poor Ttranmere side and rose up to a solid 2-0 win. Goals from Tyrone Barnett and Alfie Potter secured the points after Danny Hylton couldn't have come more close to scoring if he tried after hitting the underside of the bar.



Northampton fell to Oxford as well when we took the three points from Chris Wilder's side after a 3-1 victory. Two goals from Danny Hylton and one from Alfie Potter saw off the former Yellow's boss.

But, knowing Oxford, form wasn't exactly consistent. We threw away a healthy 1-0 lead to Carlisle, which the northern team went onto to win 2-1 in the 73rd and 90th minutes. To add to the pain, Oxford lost the local derby at home to Wycombe. After a controversial penalty, we took the lead from Danny Hylton. But two goals from the Wanderers after half time saw them victorious. Danny Hylton had the chance to level the match in the 90th minute with another penalty, but skied the ball over the bar.

Oxford face Grimsby away in the FA Cup and sit 19th in the table, with Danny Hylton topping the League scoring chart.

CHOOSING THE RIGHT CHRISTMAS DINNER

We all want our Christmas dinner to be special and a meal to remember for the right reasons! So how can you make sure that your bird is the best choice?

First take the time to buy your meat from a source you trust. You might prefer a trusted butcher, farm shop or mail order company.

Knowing how your meat has been reared and where it came from can help you determine the likely quality of the meat. Usually higher quality comes from younger animals that are subject to greater welfare standards. Of course prices will also reflect this so battery-reared birds will be much cheaper than those which have been subject to a mainly organic diet and free-roaming. Look for birds with unblemished skin, and if buying fresh

check whether they will be dressed or whether you will need to do additional preparation.

Consider carefully the size of the bird you require. General recommendations allow around half a pound or 225 g per person for boneless meat and three quarters of a pound or 340g per person for meat with a bone in. Of course appetites vary and you may want to buy larger deliberately, in order to have enough for leftovers.



Winter Looms

As we face winter and all she brings, I always like to look back at what autumn offered us.

Rich earth tone colors, falling leaves, everything preparing to take a well-deserved rest over the winter. Migrant's from north, leaves turning falling, fungi. A season of mists and mellow fruitfulness - beautiful colours signaling the coming winter and end of year - harvest. Crunchy leaves conkers and new school uniforms. Bejeweled cobwebs glittering in the autumn sun after a frost or a mist.

These are just some of the descriptive terms you have mentioned to me. What about winter though, what to you reflects the winter season?

Plenty to do out in the wildlife garden in winter though. Fruit trees and hedges to be pruned, but don't overdo it, leave some to berry to provide food and shelter. The pruning's can be turned into stick piles and used to thicken up the bases of hedges as well.

It's a great season in which you may have the time to consider some big projects digging a pond, for example, making some new wildlife nestboxes or digging out a new flowerbed.

What the wildlife wants at this time of year though is food, water and shelter, so don't

be tidying everything away or raking up every leaf in sight. Under a layer of leaves can be a degree or two warmer so that's where much of the wildlife could be. Garden by all means but care needs to be taken to avoid wholesale destruction. It won't just be hedgehogs hibernating under those leaves under your hedge.

The world won't come to an end if those leaves stay there will it?

any of us look forward to celebrating Christmas with our work colleagues. It's a chance to get out of the office and have a bit of fun. But for some employees the morning after is full of embarrassment and regret. Your behaviour at such events could seriously damage your career. Equally, if handled correctly you can also do a lot of good for your career at the annual festivities. So here are a few tips to help you be remembered for all the right reasons:

Always attend- whilst you may think not attending is the safest option, it is best to go along even if it's for just a short while as this demonstrates your willingness to be part of a team.

Dress appropriately- you may be excited by the opportunity to get out of your work attire but remember that you are still with work colleagues and probably your boss. Where you are going will have an impact on how you dress but whatever the venue its best to avoid clothing that is overtly sexual.



TOYS FOR BOYS???

y sister and I grew up with an older brother and we thought nothing of spending Saturday afternoons sprawled on the living room carpet, constructing items out of his beloved Lego. His creations were always more ambitious and sophisticated than ours of course – windmills and tractors and mansions with masses of rooms compared with our rather mundane boxlike structures. Occasionally we would ditch the Lego for a session on his Scalextric racing set. We hadn't a hope of winning, but we certainly enjoyed trying!

It never once occurred to me that I was playing with 'boy toys' which is maybe why, when I became mother to four daughters, I happily bought them their own sets of Lego along with other 'boyish' toys such as remote control cars, science sets and basketball nets (they had their fair share of dolls, prams and jewellery kits too!).

Like it or not, the society we live in stereotypes children according to their gender. Manufacturers influence their choice of toys with labels identifying items such as dolls and tea sets as 'girl toys' in their pretty pink packaging, and cars and construction sets as 'boy toys' in their predominantly blue wrappers.

There is evidence to suggest that girls and boys do naturally select different types of toys. Experiments conducted on primates concluded that male monkeys were drawn to boy-toys like cars whilst female monkeys preferred girl-toys like dolls.

There are various explanations about why boys and girls have different toy preferences. One theory suggests it is due to testosterone levels, whilst another attributes it to the way the brains are 'differently-wired', and there's no doubt that nurture and socialisation also play a part. Regardless of the reason, the consensus of opinion is that if children are offered a wide range of

toys and experiences, they will develop into more rounded individuals with an expanded range of thinking and skills.

Just as playing with girl-toys like dolls and tea sets fosters the development of verbal and social skills that might be useful to the male population, playing with boy-toys like

cars can help girls with the acquisition of spatial skills. Other 'boy-toys' like science sets, Lego, Meccano and K'nex help develop STEM (science, technology, engineering and maths) skills of which there is currently a shortage in the UK workforce - and why shouldn't girls develop these just as much as their male counterparts?!

Some may argue – and I'm probably one of them – that at the end of the day whether male or female, children will be children and will naturally choose the toys that interest them the most. The important thing is to at least give them that choice!


