K TV, also known as Ultra HD or UHD, is the next evolution in television picture quality. With a picture composed of 3,840 x 2,160 pixels - more than 8 million in total - it has four times the amount of HD (high definition) sets.

More pixels mean greater image clarity, finer detail, better texture and improved colour resolution. The net result is images that look incredibly lifelike and so detailed that at times they feel almost 3D – without the need for funny glasses!

The first wave of 4K TVs were large – very large – with 84 inch panels and £20k price tags to match. Prices have now dropped along with screen size, and you can buy entry models for under £1,000 from all the big brands such as Samsung, Panasonic, LG and Sony. You can also pay many thousands of pounds for monster sets!

Generally 4K TV screens are at least 40 inches. Some say you shouldn't view on anything less than 55 inches. This is because the advantages of pixel-dense display diminish as the screen size shrinks. Big really is better! Similarly 4K TV is best viewed close up (ideally at a distance 1.5 x screen height), though practically most homes cannot accommodate viewing from closer than 2-3 metres.

The technology for crystal-clear viewing

may be with us, but currently there are no 4K TV channels being broadcast. The main source of 4K content is the internet, from sites such as Netflix, YouTube and Amazon Prime Instant Video, and to successfully stream you would need a consistent broadband speed of at least 15Mbps.

That said, UHD TVs do a remarkable job of up-scaling HD and standard definition pictures to 4K pixel count, so 'everyday' viewing such as Freeview HD TV, Blu-ray movies and DVDs can be boosted to near 4K picture quality. However be warned that some models are better at doing this than others.

4K technology is still work in progress. In future, it may also extend to higher frame rates (HFR), greater contrast and wider colour spectrum. The BBC has plans to offer 4K programming by 2016 but only in a limited form and although BT and Sky are rumoured to have plans, nothing has been finalised. It will be 2-3 years until most video content becomes available.

So, if you want the absolute best that TV has to offer and don't mind waiting to enjoy the full benefits of your 4K TV, then go ahead and buy now. But purchase from a top tier manufacture for the best chance of future-proofing your set and also make sure that you buy a model with two HDMI 2.0 ports.







f you are new to wildlife gardening and just dipping your toe, you may wonder where you should start. I always advise, just to start somewhere, doesn't matter where, just start. That first step is always the hardest.

Look and see what wildlife is living around you already in the garden you have. Watch and learn, allowing yourself space to just enjoy your garden and building up an understanding about what is already using your garden as a home, and its preferences', may lead you to felling less inclined to 'tidy' all the time.

We live such fast and frenetic lives, hardly giving ourselves time to just 'be', or time to just enjoy our gardens. Giving ourselves space is often overlooked in the pursuit of getting on and doing stuff.

If you want to plant something straight away to help wildlife before you crack on with this watching and learning exercise, take the chance this month to plant a tree. If you only have a small garden, a small tree is fine. It will give you height but also an entire new habitat

in many instances. A Crab Apple or Rowan are good easy choices. You'll be stunned how quick the birds will begin to use new trees and perches.

If things like 'weeds' come a calling, don't stress, remember you are building food chains in wildlife gardening or Food Webs which is the latest buzz term. Many of what we call weeds are good food sources for birds if we let them seed in Autumn. After a while a natural balance takes over in the garden, and these weeds are just as important to your enjoyment and insects, birds and mammals. Don't get me wrong, wildlife gardening doesn't have to be untidy as such. What I do know is gardening isn't stressful in itself, so if you are rushing around trying to keep up with the gardening, and getting yourself stressed, you must be doing something wrong.

Challenge yourself to garden in a more relaxed way, feel the acidity levels decrease in your body and watch your wellbeing improve. Good luck!





indows, Mac or Linux? What is an Operating System and why are they different?

Operating Systems are the basis of your computing experience. When you switch on your computer, the Operating System has to load, in order to provide the framework for all of the other software on your system.

A program or piece of software written for Windows will not run on Linux or Mac OS. This is the primary source of confusion for software users. So why won't your Windows program run on a Mac?

Well, let's use an analogy. Honda and Vauxhall both make cars. There are common components to the car. There's an engine, a gearbox, wheels, a steering area, doors and a body. Both cars, regardless of manufacturer, use the same *concepts* but their implementation is different. For example, while both vehicles are propelled using the same technology, a seat designed for a Honda is simply not going to fit in a Vauxhall, no matter how much you try.

Your Operating System works on the same principle. All computers have a processor, RAM and peripherals, but the Operating System is the interior of the carspecific features for that specific model.

So which is best? It's easy to stop and

assume that Windows is the *best* because it's the most commonly used, but it has major disadvantages as well. It's susceptible to many attacks, because of it's popularity. Windows is commercial software, and you never own your copy of Windows, you merely license it from Microsoft.

Apple's Mac OS is technically more robust, because it is based off a system that's been running and perfected since the early days of computing back in the 1960s. But it will only work on Apple Hardware (well, it will run on most PCs, but you need to own an Apple product and have a little technical knowledge to make it work). And then there's Linux, which is, like Mac OS, based on Unix, but is completely free. That's both "Free" as in "beer" as well as "Free" as in "Speech". Linux has traditionally been used to power the internet for businesses since the mid 1990s, but has now gained traction and competes with the two commercial giants on the Desktop. Linux is far more cutting-edge than Windows or Mac OS, but it comes with it's learning curves.

So which one is for you? The answer is simple. Many people will tell you their favourite OS is "the best" but the simplest answer is to try them out, and the one that feels like the right fit? THAT is the best one for you.
