arch 17th is St Patrick's Day - a celebration of all things Irish - and people around Ireland and throughout the world will commemorate it with a pint or two of Guinness, Ireland's unofficial national intoxicant, with more than a 25% share of the beer market.

Arthur Guinness founded the brewery that makes the famous drink. Born in 1725 in County Kildare, Arthur inherited £100 at the age of 27 from his godfather, and three years later he set up business as a brewer. In 1759 he signed a 9,000 year lease on a disused brewery in St James Gate, Dublin where he began brewing porter and ale.

Porter is a dark, well-hopped beer made from brown malt. Its history is closely intertwined with that of stout, a term which originally referred to a beer's strength but which now refers to the drink's body and colour.

Today's Guinness is a dry stout available in a number of variants and strengths, including Guinness Draught, Guinness Original/Extra Stout, Guinness Foreign Extra Stout, Guinness Special Export Stout and Guinness Bitter. It is nicknamed 'the black stuff' on account of its dark colour, although it is actually a very dark shade of ruby!

Now brewed in 60 countries and available in over 120, the first Guinness export was to England in 1769, and by 1824 it had become a worldwide brand. Sales soared from 350,000 barrels in 1868 to over a million eighteen years later. However, by the 1970s sales were in decline and the company decided to make Guinness Extra Stout 'more drinkable', resulting in a brand re-launch in 1981 with pale malt being used for the first time.

Contemporary Guinness Draught and Extra Light Stout are weaker than their 19th Century counterpart, with Foreign Extra Stout and Special Export being closer to the original in character. Modern Guinness has a burnt flavour and is famous for its smoothness and thick, creamy head.

The production of Guinness continues to change with the times. In November last year the company announced plans to make their beer suitable for vegetarians and vegans by the end of 2016, through the introduction of a new filtration process that will avoid the need to use isinglass from fish bladders.

Claims have been made in the past that Guinness can benefit the heart by helping to prevent harmful deposit build-up on artery walls. It has also been described as a 'meal in a glass', and at 198 calories per pint, has slightly fewer calories than skimmed milk, orange juice and most other light beers.

So, I wish you a happy St Patrick's Day, filled with friends, fun, smiles and a drop of the black stuff.

A special concert on 18 March* will celebrate the 30th anniversary of Headington Singers, a non-auditioning community choir. And the occasion will also mark the 20th anniversary of our conductor, the amazing Sally Mears.

The choir started in a modest way with a handful of women (men were late starters!), whatever



scores we could lay hands on and a pianist, Maureen Cooper, who has been our wonderful accompanist ever since. Having tried all kinds of musical styles, we realised that we had the nucleus of a conventional choral society and that called for a 'proper' conductor. Under the baton of Mark Goddard we were ready to tackle our first really big work in March 1989, Haydn's *Nelson Mass*.

Since then the choir has gone from strength to strength, thanks in no small measure to the boundless energy and enthusiasm of Sally Mears. We now number around 80-90 singers and tackle a wide variety of choral music, from Schutz to Karl Jenkins. Our termly concerts are usually held in All Saints' Church but we have

also sung in Oxford

Town Hall on several occasions and in Dorchester Abbey. We try to be musically adventurous and have even commissioned works from local composers but, like every choir, we love coming back to the 'classics' and will be singing excerpts from *Messiah* at our celebratory concert. Please join us!

These articles and my wider work these days is about developing new ways for people to enjoy their gardens, see them in a new light and enjoy the wildlife therein. Bringing to people's attention through their senses and experiencing more fully what is really in front of them, in that moment, is a real de-stressing skill and perfect for keeping balance in all our lives.

The emphasis is so much on the thoughts being the thing to address in finding balance, but what is really happening physically in the human body and mind when we enjoy the nature around us. We know getting out and connecting with nature is good for us, but what is going on.

We recognize that tingly feeling when we are out in the thick over Mother Nature, but what is really happening, what is it that causes that tingly feeling?

I am hoping to run a series of nature sensory workshops with Oxford University students and also help develop a full study within the University itself to try and collect data exploring what physically happens to our bodies when out in nature.

I suspect a lot of what's going on is the electrical impulses given and received by the brain during our countryside wanders. Is it all to do with the nervous system though? Is it that we breathe more deeply when out in nature, meaning we have more oxygen in our system so our bodies can actually function properly.

Is what's going on in our bodies different at differing stages in live, say, toddler, teenager, adult, and pensioner?

If we understand what's going on when we are out in nature, are we able to sustain that process when we return back to the hustle and bustle that can be life?

Next time you are out in the wildlife garden, observe yourself. What's happening in your mind and in your body too? It's something we take for granted but worth exploring I think.

I talk about not just looking, but seeing. Not just touching, but feeling. Not just listening but hearing too. That's not enough though I'm coming to realise. To get the whole experience from a wildlife garden, we need to understand too.



"My Internet is Broken" Understanding the difference between network services

ne of the most common complaints I get in my daily routine as a computer guy is the simple statement "my internet is not working".

In 99% of cases, this ends up not being true. But I'm here to help you diagnose your internet problems, by helping you to understand that the "Internet" and the "web" are not the same thing.

The terms are used incorrectly as synonyms, but it is not the case.

Your "Internet" connection provides all of your connectivity down your line, but the "web" is the stuff you visit in your "web browser". Websites are not called "Internet Sites" for a reason.

The "Internet" itself is made up of many protocols, which are instructions on how a service is communicated.

Your web browser and the "web" are only a small area of the wider internet, and understanding that will help you diagnose problems.

If your computer is not showing up web pages in your favourite browser, it may not be that the connection itself is broken, but could be anything in the chain link of getting the information to your screen.

The obvious test of this if your web isn't working is to open up a terminal and 'ping' google's name servers. In Windows, you open a command prompt and type "ping 8.8.8.8" and press enter. If your console gives you 4 lines saying "Reply from 8.8.8.8", then you can immediately rule out your internet connection as the problem, and this will help you communicate with your technician more effectively.

Email, FTP, DNS and many other 3 letter acronyms are all identifying different types of "internet" service, and the web, or "http", is just one of those.

However, in order to get a page to your desktop, your webbrowser will use a few other internet services in order to give you a seamless experience. And sometimes this just goes wron, either on the service provider side, or on your own machine. If a reboot doesn't solve the problem, and you still can't get on the web, but you can get a ping reply, then the problem is likely to be a DNS problem.

DNS (Domain Name Service) is the system that takes the address you type into the bar (google.co.uk) and turns it into a number that computers can understand. Think of the domain name as a house name (google. com) and it's computer IP address (8.8.8.8) as a postcode.

In order for Google to give you the page, it needs to receive a connection, and the DNS service is in charge of being the 'directory' of addresses. If DNS breaks or fails to function for any reason, the entire "internet" experience will appear to have stopped, when that is not necessarily the case. The problems can easily be diagnosed and fixed in a phone call to your technician and you'll save a fortune on calling out someone to type four numbers into a box in your settings."

Oxford returned to winning ways the next weekend after a much needed 1-0 win at Portsmouth. New signing, and former Premier League striker Jordan Bowery scored 7 minutes into his Oxford debut. A much needed 3 points in the league.

The next fixture was the result of our labour against Swansea. Paul Lambert's Blackburn

Rovers in the FA Cup fourth round. After a very slow start, Blackburn took the lead with a penalty on 36 minutes. The situation was made worse after they netted just before half time. The damage was completed when they scored a good free kick with 15 minutes to go. The dream was over, but there was another big game to focus on...

after his contract was terminated by mutual consent.
