Heroic Yellows Fall Just Short

s with my report of the FA Cup Swansea victory, I will briefly skip through the results that preceded the 3rd time Oxford would play Wembley.

Oxford drew 2-2 away at 3rd placed Plymouth. Kemar Roofe and a Plymouth own goal were not enough for the three points. On the return to the Kassam, Oxford lost 1-0 to Levton Orient, but turned it around only three days later to win 4-0 against Dagenham and Redbridge. A wonderful Kemar Roofe hat-trick and an added goal from Alex MacDonald tied up an easy win. Oxford then beat Barnet away 3-0 courtesy of two Callum O'Dowda goals, and one from Danny Hylton. The Yellows then drew at home to Stevenage after Liam Secombe netted for Oxford, but John Lundstram saw straight red after a reckless challenge, ensuring he would miss the Wembley final. The final game before Wembley was at Cambridge where both teams saw out a 0-0 draw.

Then Wembley beckoned... Oxford went into the game as underdogs but have scalps from a number of higher league opposition this season including Brentford (Championship), Swindon (League 1), Swansea City (Premier League), and Millwall (League 1). Oxford though were without Jake Wright and Joe Skarz due to injury, yet Johnny Mullins who was initially a doubt, captained the side on the day. John Lundstram was unfortunately out of the side as he had picked up a red card against Stevenage.

The Yellows got off to a strong start as they were cheered on by 34,000 Oxford fans. The first real chance of the game came when Jordan Evans

had a marvellous free kick saved by the Barnsley keeper. Had the kick been a few inches closer to the post, he would have surely scored.

At the other end, Benji Büchel demonstrated great courage and firm hands as he fended off a number of close attempts from the Barnsley forwards. But the first goal of the game arrived from Oxford local and academy graduate, Callum O'Dowda after 29 minutes with a firm header after a brilliant Alex MacDonald cross.

But after half time, Barnsley seemed like a new team. Chey Dunkley scored an unlucky own goal seven minutes after half time to put Barnsley back in the game as he attempted to block a shot. Then fifteen minutes later, Ashley Fletcher of the Tykes scored to put Barnsley in the lead.

Then to make matters worse, Adam Hammill scored an excellent individual goal to make the score 3-1. But only two minutes later, Danny Hylton scored a close range header to provide the perfect response.

Unfortunately for Oxford, this was not enough

for the win, or to take the game further. Barnsley came away victors with 3-2 as the final score line, but the team was heroic, and getting to Wembley was a victory in any case. Congratulations to the JPT runners up, Oxford United!

t this time of year as we spend more time out in our gardens we actually become more aware of the birds that share the space with us. One such species we don't always think of as a garden bird, but is well adapted to the garden setting is the Long Tailed Tit. From childhood I've always called them 'Garden Budgerigars', to me that's what they look like.

To make our gardens attractive to these friendly and excitable creatures we just need a selection of larger bushes and hedges. They can be seen in gardens year round but often in Winter they can be overlooked as they often flock with other species.

They do seem to prefer deciduous plantings in gardens that have a woodland feel, typically of oak, ash and sycamore species. For nesting, preference is shown towards thorny bushes less than 3 metres above the ground. They also like confers and tall bamboo's too.

The nest is constructed from - lichen, feathers, cocoons and moss. The nest is a sac with a small, round entrance on top, suspended either low in bushes or high up in the forks of tree branches. Nests have a high rate of predation sadly, which can be very disappointing.

A nice consequence of that is that a breeding pair that have lost their nest or young will turn their attention to helping others of their species raise their own young. We can all learn a neighbourly lesson for that me thinks!

Their main food source is insects and eggs and larvae of moths but in Autumn and Winter they do adapt to eat seeds.

In flocks they have constant contact, calls become faster when the birds cross open ground or if an individual becomes separated from the main body of the flock. It's the calls that makes us aware they are around as the generally flit around silently otherwise.

Pretty simple for many of us to attract these lovely little birds to our gardens then?

later, in 1968, the festival closed its gates once more, mid-way through due to student and worker-uprisings.

Nowadays the

Films of all genres are screened between May $11^{\text{th}} - 22^{\text{nd}}$ as the population of the city swells from around 80,000 to 200,000 across the two week period. But it hasn't always been the lavish affair it is today.

A man by the name of Jean Zay had the idea for the festival in 1939, however due to the imminent threat of World War II, the opening year was delayed until 1946 and its revival used as a way of encouraging tourism again in the French Riviera.

In 1948 and 1950 the event was cancelled due to a lack of funding and twenty years

festival is believed to have a budget of €20 million with 850 staff employed to cover the occasion. Although most of the festival has a strict access policy, and you won't get to walk down the iconic red carpet (which, incidentally, is changed three times a day!), as a regular tourist you can buy tickets to a number of screenings including the 'Director's Fortnight Section' and can access several free screenings, some of which have Q & A's with up-and-coming directors.



It's really important to wear sunglasses, to protect your eyes against harmful ultraviolet (UV) light. UV rays can cause damage to your eyes which could lead to cataracts



These cause clouding of the lens, reduced vision and even blindness if left untreated. Most sunglasses now filter out both UVA and UVB rays.

There is a vast array of sunglasses to choose from including prescription sunglasses. There may be a few styles that aren't suitable for your prescription but an expert can advise on this.

It is important to think about the shape of your face to determine which sunglasses may suit you best. Decide whether your face is heart shaped, round, oval or square, as this will help you work out whether square frames, cat's eye shape, aviator style, shield, oversized or sport may work best for you. Those with heartshaped faces will generally find that frames that are wider at the top than the bottom will look best, whilst oversized, rectangular and angular frames will counterbalance a round face and shallow rectangular frames will visually shorten a long face.

Think about your colouring too. What frame colours will suit your skin tone and hair colouring? Those who are fair may find pastel shades or transparent frames most complimentary. Of course you may want to make a statement and choose a bolder frame. Sunglass lenses are usually plastic for increased durability and versatility. Some opticians offer a range of different colour lenses from the more traditional browns and greys to yellows, blues and green.

Different tints suit particular circumstances such as green for enhancing contrast and thus being really helpful for those who play sports like golf.

There are a variety of tints too. Dark tints are best for mountains and sea and lightly-tinted for more urban and general environments.

All sunglasses reduce brightness, but to reduce glare as well, you need polarized lenses. They are particularly effective when driving, skiing or fishing as they block glare increase contrast.

As with all spectacles you have the choice of designer brands such as Ray Ban, Ted Baker and Oakley or nondesigner. There is an element of fashion and celebrity endorsement too. "Your privacy online" Are you really the only person reading your email?

very now and again, the UK government does something nasty that inadvertently helps smaller businesses. This year, the Draft Investigatory Powers Bill, not very affectionately also referred to as the "Snooper's Charter", is one such event.

As our freedoms and liberties are systematically stripped from us in the name of 'security', the 'step too far' that the government is taking by proposing and introducing this piece of legislation to parliament is their desire to intercept everyone's email.

That's everyone. You, me, and if your cat has email, you can bet that GCHQ has a copy of that too. And the conspiracy theorist in me says that while the bill hasn't yet been approved through parliament, you can be pretty sure they are already doing it.

So what does it mean to you?

At first glance, you could be forgiven for saying things like "Well, in the interest of national security, it's OK" or "I never have anything interesting to say anyway, so I'm not bothered", but the simple fact is that you absolutely should be bothered, worried and concerned.

You may be a completely innocent civilian, and you may argue that GCHQ doesn't have the manpower to read 60 million emails per day, and you'd be right. If that was how it works.

But how the system works is that a computer program CAN read 60 million emails a day, and does. It scans every email you send outwards for 'keywords'. When a keyword is flagged, the system then flags YOU as someone that a human should take a look at. So if you make an innocuous joke about terrorism in an email, that will get flagged, and a human analyst will then quickly look through your emails to ensure that you were, in fact, 'only joking'. And that's an invasion of privacy that no-one wants.

How long is it before the same system is used to detect your financial or tax affairs as

well. When I worked on the development of the Congestion Charging System in London back in 2001, we were assured by the authorities that the number plate recognition system would only ever be used for detecting payments for the congestion system. Then they added a couple of bits of functionality, and now whenever you drive in the CC zone in London, not only your congestion charge details are checked, but your insurance and tax status, and if there are any convictions against your name, and if there are, you can be pretty sure the Met will mysteriously and randomly pull you over once within the zone.

While it's important for national security to root out terrorism, the track record of government shows that this would likely not be the primary purpose for long.

The solution to this is what benefits smaller businesses. In the days before the "free" email giants, people looked to small, local service providers to provide their email services. Returning to this system effectively bypasses the monitoring and allows you a greater sense of control over your own communications. This is because the bill allows them to bully their way into the big corporations' systems, but they can't get a backdoor into a smaller provider. So while emails sent TO you will still likely be read by Big Brother, going back and supporting local email providers like the 'good old days' will at least give you the piece of mind of knowing that what YOU send out will ONLY be read by the recipient you decide.

The freshly graduated IT analyst will not be watching your email, and you can claim back just a little of that privacy that keeps being stripped from us.

It turns out that the old adage is true: There is no such thing as a free lunch (or email), and while it may be free of financial charge to have that gmail email address, is it truly free?



The Winter Ghosts – by Kate Mosse

This is an unusually short novel by Kate Mosse at just 250 pages. However readers won't be

disappointed as Mosse once again takes us back to the South of France and the area in the Pyrenees which provided the haunting backdrop to her weightier Labyrinth novels.

It is 1933, and an Englishman visits a book antiquarian in France with a strange manuscript written in the now extinct Occitan language of the region. The antiquarian is curious and wants to know how an Englishman would have it in his possession. Slowly, the foreigner tells his story.

In 1928, with Europe still recovering from the aftermath of World War 1, Freddie is recovering from an illness. Still struggling to come to terms with the death of his older brother George, his doctor suggests a trip to France where the mountain air in the south may help his recovery. He is consumed by grief and guilt over George's death and welcomes the opportunity to visit the country where his beloved brother died.

A car crash during a storm in the mountains sees him stranded in the oddly desertedlooking village of Nulle. He finds lodgings and the next day is invited to attend the Fete de Sainte-Etienne, a celebration of the village's past. It is here that he meets Fabrissa, a beautiful mysterious woman.

Mosse cleverly allows us to see the psychological effects of grief. As in the *Labyrinth* trilogy she embeds the story in the medieval history of the Cathars (an ancient sect of Christianity, long since destroyed) in the region. Are there such things as ghosts or do we create them in our mind to deal with the events that appear doomed to reoccur throughout history? Or are ghosts merely the reminder of mistakes that we are condemned to repeat?

Cloudberry Castle: Ballet School Secrets by Janey Louise Jones

This is the second book in the Cloudberry Castle series. The first introduced balletmad Katie and her family. Following the death of their elderly neighbour the Mackenzie family find themselves the owners of Cloudberry Castle. The crumbling building could be beautiful and the book follows Katie and her family as they raise enough money to turn it into a new ballet boarding school. At the start of this second book the school is about to open. Katie's mother was a dancer with the New York City Ballet and has spent the last few months planning classes, ordering costumes, and holding auditions, whilst her dad has been hard at work transforming the rooms into ballet studios, classrooms, and dormitories.

When September arrives Katie is in heaven. She gets to dance all day and soon makes friends with some of the other girls. Her mum is planning to stage Sleeping Beauty at the end of the year and Katie would love to play Princess Aurora. However, one of the new students, Leo, seems to be about to put a dampener on things. She arrives with a private chauffeur and pony and clearly thinks she is better than everyone else. Katie begins to worry that she is not as good at ballet as she thought she was. Can she win the role of Princess Aurora?

Combined with a discovery in the grounds of Cloudberry Castle which may well reveal some long-hidden secrets, this novel is perfect for a young ballet fan. Katie is a very

likeable narrator and Jones is an engaging writer. This is aimed at readers aged 8+ and its 141 pages are split into 28 manageable chapters for young readers looking to gain more confidence.
