

Following this, Oxford held Charlton Athletic at home to a 1-1 draw, with Chris Maguire scoring the equalising goal. This game put pressure on the U's to take victory away at Southend. Again, Kane Hemmings scored away from home, but his goal wasn't enough as The Shrimpers came away with a 2-1 win.

However, Oxford pulled off a shock, yet well-deserved triumph over highly rated side, Bolton Wanderers. After a hard fought 80 minutes, Wes Thomas broke the deadlock, only for Chris Maguire to bury the game at 90 minutes. Not too bad for a 2-0 win against a side in the Championship last year!

Now in other news, rumours are beginning to circulate that former Chairman and owner Firoz Kassam is willing to sell the Kassam Stadium to the club... I don't know any more details, but will be sure to keep you updated! COME ON YOU YELLOWS!

We know autumn has started but how many people really experience it?

We know the autumn incoming migrant birds are arriving and we may notice some like the Redwings scratching around under trees, bushes, in parks, gardens, supermarket car parks and even school playgrounds. However, how many people truly notice the changeover between seasons?

Close your eyes for a moment and think what does autumn mean to me? How does autumn make me feel? What does it feel like? Listen to the soundscape around you wherever you are. What does autumn sound like? Take a deep breath and smell the landscape around you. What does autumn smell like?

When you close your eyes, what colour is autumn? What shape is autumn?

When harvesting crops from the veg plot cook them up and put them on a plate to eat. Really concentrate on the taste and textures of the food. What does autumn taste like? Once you've done those exercises, revisit the question – do I really notice the change in seasons? What does autumn mean to me and

how does it make me feel?

When I think of autumn and consider what it means to me, it is a chance to regroup and catch up after the rigours of summer. When I think about how it makes me feel, it's as though I feel burnt out and in need of a rest - it feels dry and parched. When I listen to the soundscape, it feels empty now the summer birds have gone. It smells like rotting undergrowth. I see the colour of autumn as yellow and red and the shape of autumn as being spiky and angular. I experience the taste of autumn as homely and comforting.

Now it's your turn to have a go at this exercise and get acquainted once again with autumn's personality...



Fireworks Fiesta!



Top tips for making your fireworks party go off with a bang...

Food and decorations

A warming autumnal soup is sure to go down well with guests, and mini sparklers are a great way to liven up sandwiches. For pudding, you could decorate cakes with coloured icing in the shape of fireworks or rockets, and don't forget the toffee apples!

To make an easy firework rocket, roll a rectangle of coloured card into a tube and stick in place with double sided tape. Cut out a circle of card, with a wedge missing, roll and tape to make a cone for the top. Stick it on and attach a wooden barbeque skewer (with the point cut off) to the inside of the tube. Fill the tube with sweets, close the bottom with a circle of card, and glue on some paper streamers. Display several in a tall glass vase.

Decorate the table with layers of coloured tissue paper in red, yellow and orange, rather than a table cloth, and string party lights around the walls. You could also try attaching streamers to colourful paper lanterns to hang from the ceiling.

Drinks

Hot chocolate with whipped cream and

marshmallows is sure to prove popular with children and drivers. You could also make a warming alcoholic drink for adults, such as mulled wine, liqueur coffee or hot toddy.

Games

If you have children coming, why not keep them busy making a Guy? You'll need to provide plenty of old material, plus stuffing. You could also premake a papier-mâché head using paper, glue and balloons,

or buy it from a craft store or eBay. Alternatively, you could have a Guy making competition, where everyone makes a smaller Guy, or decorates a gingerbread man, with a prize for the winner

Kids and adults alike love a piñata, and you can buy them in a variety of shapes. Fill yours with sweets or small treats, such as stickers and balloons, and hang it outside from a tree. Make sure you give whoever's swinging the stick plenty of space!

Fireworks

Most people will want to watch the fireworks from outside, so you might want to dig out some spare blankets, gloves and hats for anyone who isn't prepared. If you're setting off your own fireworks, take time to explain the danger to children, and make it clear how far back they need to stand. You'll also want to ensure that any pets are safely inside. Of course, it's safer and cheaper to take advantage of a nearby firework display. They can be seen for miles, so you may well be able to stay in your own garden, avoid the crowds and make the most of those warming drinks...



Controversial Musings

hen did we become a society that was so afraid of opinions?
Headington Monthly is a magazine that has, since it's inception, had a policy of non-offence. But the problem with that is (a) you can't please everyone all of the time and (b) the magazine ends up generic and full of content that is innocent and sweet, but without any actual substance. We want to see a readership that is hungry to discover what is in the next issue, rather than just see it as a kind of parish newsletter.

And I write this with full knowledge that I, personally, am the guilty party. I assemble the magazine each month, and I keep the content as inoffensive as possible.

But still, people take offence. Last month, our magazine had a tongue-in-cheek, yet striking cover poking a bit of fun at the roadworks. This year we have deliberately avoided all of the cliche magazine themes. In February, we avoided Valentine's day. In March we successfully avoided Easter, and last month we worked hard to completely avoid Halloween. Don't worry, Christmas remains protected and the December issue will remain as festive as ever.

Now, although our cover last month was clearly fun (I've always wanted an excuse to use the umbrella gag), we received complaints that it was offensive, would hurt businesses and our advertisers would leave us in droves. We disagree. And so it would appear do the advertisers. In this issue we've had the biggest single monthly increase in new advertisers since we launched in 2010. But if we disagree, then we get told that we aren't listening, or that we are alienating people, or - worse - that we are the reason Brexit happened. You know, with us being part of the older generation and all that. We have heard it all, from some valid complaints right through to hysterical name calling because someone took offence.

Here's the thing. Offence is something that is taken. Nobody in history has ever 'given offence' to another person. They may commit offences against people, but the concept of offence to words, thoughts and opinions is a subjective one, and there is no way of telling, in this modern world, what is going to offend someone.

So, as a result, we end up self-censoring. This is Oxford, my friends. Some of the greatest names in history have debated here. Some of the greatest triumphs for our freedoms have been hashed out in debates in this very city of ours. The varied nature of our society and diverse culture is something that has been celebrated here for almost

a thousand years. But it's only been in the last 10 years that discussion and simple words and exchange of opinion have become a violent battle ground. If I say something that offends someone, mob mentality seeks to silence me rather than attempt to understand my point of view. Nothing has brought this attitude to the fore more than the recent referendum, which has divided everyone over an idea, belief or concept.

Even 25 years ago, before the rise of Social Justice hysteria, safe-spaces and 'hate speech', divided communities didn't happen. We had the 'token left winger' or 'token right winger' in our social groups that - while we may not have agreed with their views, we never took it out on the person themselves. We didn't attack someone's character simply because they didn't 'think the same way as the majority'. Sure, if there was someone in the group who had a different opinion, we would mock them relentlessly, but it was never taken in anything other than good humour. Because friends and family are supposed to trump (geddit?) opinions. And that is right.



always find myself being asked, and sometimes scolded, about my rates as a computer guy.

I'm told, too often, that I 'don't charge enough', and that bugs me. Not because I should be charging more, but because the real crime here is simply how the industry has shaped the minds of the general population to think that what I consider to be extortionate rates are 'normal'. And here I will explain why.

The big computer super chain in Britain that I shall not name, seems to think that 10-15% of the price of the machine is fair play for simply looking at your computer. And if they find something wrong, the cost of repair can easily grow to outweigh the value of the computer itself.

Whichever way I look at it, it's not a fair structure. Unless there is a major, major problem, diagnosing a PC shouldn't take more than 10 minutes, so why is the standard charge £50 just for diagnosing, and then the same hourly rate for repairs? System repairs routinely take in excess of 5-8 hours, so before long the cost of replacing a hard drive (the hardware generally costs less than £40) in a computer, and restoring the software from your old drive (if they can be bothered to do it at all, rather than simply telling you it's unrecoverable) can set you up with a bill of £300-£450.

And people pay it - often with a smile and a sense of satisfaction at recovering their beloved machine, often with total data loss.

What if I told you you were being ripped off? I don't mean 'ripped off for a few extra quid', but well and truly 'daylight highwayman' ripped off. Well, if you're honest, you always knew it, but let me break down the expense. I try to explain this to all of my clients when they bring up this topic.

Let's say that 8 hours is a standard timeframe for repairing a PC with a broken hard drive. 7 and a half of those hours will be made up of waiting. Waiting, with no human interaction, for software to install, scans to complete, and updates to grab. For that time, you're being charged per hour or part thereof, but there is no human interaction, and no actual cost other than the electricity it takes to keep your machine running on the testbed. Assuming you have a power supply of 1000W (which is huge), this cost comes to little more than a pound.

I work differently, and it's not something I plan to change, simply for greed. I charge for the amount of work I do, and not for the waiting. It's morally and ethically wrong for me to do that, and in keeping with my personal philosophy of fairness in all my dealings, I cannot, in good conscience, take money from your already squeezed pocket for work I didn't do.

And that brings me to my point. just because I'm not as expensive or unfair about how I charge, this doesn't make the quality of my work bad. My clients will tell you that I try to go the extra mile where I can, and I don't arbitrarily delete data and reset systems just because it's the 'easier' way.

Yet, still some people seem to think that fairness equates to a lack of quality, or that because I work from home and not a workshop with fancy flashing lights, that my credibility is in question. Yes, I've had those too.

But, for the most part, I have a very positive relationship with my customers, and the personal service and something as simple as knowing your name and how your system is configured, is generally greatly appreciated.

In a world where corporate interests and extortionate rates are the norm, isn't it worth looking at options that are more fair, that support local businesses? Headington is a great town, with great people, but the economy of small business is being swallowed by massive chains, faceless and careless. I stopped eating at McDonalds and buying from Starbucks a while back, and started shopping locally, and dining our at some of the many great momand-pop businesses that really need our custom to survive. Headington Monthly is testament to that. It showcases that there are a great many alternatives to 'what you know'. But small businesses, like mine. need to be unafraid to do honest business. Because when plumbers, electricians, repairmen etc all start working fairly, they will realise that the economy, locally, will thrive. Because Headington residents are loval to their town, and honest businesses that do not extort clients bring a lower cost of living to the residents, which means more disposable income, and less stress all round.

And in a world determined to squeeze every last penny from you at every opportunity, isn't that something we really need?
