# DYSPRAXIA AWARENESS WEEK

11th - 17th October.

yspraxia is also known as Developmental Coordination Disorder, and occurs in both adults and children. It can affects fine and gross motor coordination. Those with the condition are often late learning to walk, stand, sit and roll and will find other standard developmental activities such as running, jumping or catching a ball more difficult. Many also experience difficulties with articulation, speech, perception and thoughts, leading to memory problems, poor organisation, planning and sequencing skills.

Dyspraxia is thought to be caused by an immaturity of neurone development in the brain which disrupts the way the brain sends messages to the body.

Harry Potter star Daniel Radcliffe announced he had the disorder in 2008. Other well known personalities affected by the condition include South Shields MP Emma Lewell- Buck, model Cara Delvingne and Jamie Lambert who is part of the Britain's Got Talent winning male singing group Collabro. Indeed, Jamie has just become a Celebrity Patron for the Charity the Dyspraxia Foundation and is fronting this year's awareness campaign. His mother Lorraine has shared her thoughts in a blog to help others. She urges people not to assume that those with the condition have limited potential.

Around 5% of the population are affected by Dyspraxia and around 2% are severely affected. Evidence shows the condition sometimes runs in families and that boys are three times more likely to be affected than girls.

Sometimes Dyspraxia occurs in isolation, but frequently it coexists with conditions such as Asperger's Syndrome (High Functioning Autism), Attention Deficit Hyperactive Disorder (ADHD), Dyslexia, language disorders, and social.

age and usually leads to referral to specialist support services. While many of those with Dyspraxia are highly intelligent, their ability to learn is often impaired and they will need to repeat things and practice more often. At a special event in Parliament in 2014, Emma Lewell-Buck said; 'I used to also suffer from low self-esteem and confidence, and for a time at school I got frustrated with having to work harder than the other kids and started to misbehave. But I realised that if I was going to make something of my life I needed to start knuckling down – even if it did take longer to grasp and understand things I knew that I was just as capable as anyone else.'

The Dyspraxia Foundation provides resources and a helpline to assist young adults affected by Dyspraxia as well as their families, teachers and healthcare professionals. There are also many local support groups.

## Scrabble(?)

I have a keen interest in Scrabble, and was on the lookout for a group to join, when I heard of one at the Community Hall, so I went along. 'There used to be about twenty members', said the welcoming official.

I waited a while and then four elderly ladies appeared and sat at the next table. As they were the only other participants, they suggested that I join them to make a fifth (not really allowed—we could have played two games of two and three people).

They explained that they had their own version of Scrabble (and it was an unusual one).

Firstly, they did not count the points scored, so any challenge or purpose in the game was lost. It may be that they didn't want to count the large numbers that are unavoidable in Scrabble, and we elderly ladies don't always have calculators.



To decide who starts, instead of drawing a tile, with the one who has the earliest tile in the alphabet starting, they had a system of choosing who can start with the longest word, so we all stated the length of our word. On finding that a six-letter word was longest, the lady started with it.

The coloured squares on the board were ignored, so doubling the value of letters and words, and tripling of letters and words on the pink, blue and red squares was no longer exciting, with the loss of considerable thought and skill. The game was made rather purposeless, although they did say that they would see how many games they could get through in the allotted time! The participants looked at each other' tiles (something strictly forbidden) and suggested where tiles could best be placed, so personal thoughts and knowledge were non-existent.

There was a slight altercation, as one lady put down 'signet' to start the game, but another said that it should be spelt 'cygnet', and it was wrong. I looked it up in a dilapidated dictionary with no covers (they didn't have a proper Scrabble one) and of course there was the word 'signet'. Having had to withdraw the word, she was helped later on to place it by the same spokeswoman, who said that if she put her 's' to make one of the words plural, then she could put the rest of 'signet' down.

Their method of the use of allowed words was rather haphazard; when I tried to make the word 'EX' they said that it was not allowed, even though other words spelling out alphabet letters, such as 'ZED' were allowed.

To use up all my tiles I put an 'E' before an 'R' to make 'ER' which indicates, in all dictionaries, hesitation. They all looked puzzled and the spokeswoman said that it really should have a hyphen in front of it?! They carried on playing for a while, although I had (in my opinion), won this particular game.

On leaving at the interval I was told that the four ladies had been playing together for a very long time (at a cost of £1.50 each per session). I explained that there were difficulties when five players were involved – words changed too many times before it was anyone's turn, so I left them to carry on as usual.

I really could not try to play their version of Scrabble – I felt that the game was being bowdlerized or expurgated (which describes books having the worst parts omitted), but in reverse; the best parts were being taken out.

The sheer delight of producing a seven letter word, using all the tiles from your rack and scoring fifty points is lost to these ladies, as they don't score at all, they just make words – but that, of course, is their prerogative.

t's been well documented that life has been challenging for me over the last few years with debilitating Rheumatoid Arthritis, which at times has incapacitated me.

Traditional and alternative medications have been sourced, but a suitable treatment programme was a struggle to find. In 2014, amidst intense pain I discovered nature sensory connections really began to help get on top of my pain management. Agreed, my mobility is still dire, but we're getting there.

I've been asked to write in depth about my findings and experience, so thought I'd write briefly about it this month too. That way, you can explore, think about and maybe get even more benefit from your wildlife gardens.

Let me start by saying I visualize my pain as a white pulsing orb. The pulses are the pain. I've been trying to think past pain for a while now, trying to extend the gaps between those pulses of pain. I meditate and I've used hypnotherapy to turn down pain in my head. When I discovered nature sensory engagement I really started to master this pain thing.

I've been a wildlife watcher for most of my life and last year started using those skills in a new way to try and manage my pain.

From our five main senses of sight, sound, touch, taste and smell, let's look at sight first.

Nip outside and have a look at your wildlife garden. Don't look intently, rest your eyes on the landscape and use your peripheral vision. Slowly begin to notice how many more shades of green you can see, and the little subtle movements that you miss if you look to intently at a spot. This is what a good birdwatcher does, resting their eyes on a space where they know there's a bird but can't locate it, by using their peripheral vision

they can quickly locate what they are looking for

Now do the same with your ears. Notice in a jungle soundscape how all the creatures inhabit a differing sound frequency, some over lapping but all audible. We humans talk over one another, and our message can be lost in the hubbub. Out in your garden, rest your ears on the soundscape around you, by listening to less note how you hear more. If there is an annoying sound in that soundscape, try and filter that out. Equate that annoyance as how I see my pain, something that we just let do its thing but just filter out.

Notice how the soundscape around you has differing frequencies, ebbing and flowing. Even if you are in a busy city, try and conduct that sound like an orchestra. Notice how the cacophony is made up of differing sounds, ebbing and flowing and overlapping. Try and break the soundscape down.

Maybe try drawing what the differing sounds may look like, draw how they make you feel.

Continue this exercise with your senses of taste, touch and smell. This can be done anywhere, and notice how the mind is distracted away from the stress, pain or challenges it may be dealing with.

What I do is try to fill those gaps between the pulses of pain with nature and my

sensory connection to it.

Have a go, maybe adapt my theory to tap into your own wellbeing, but if nothing else, use this idea to maybe get even more pleasure from your own wildlife garden. Beginning to maybe sense things you have been walking past on a daily basis and taking for granted.






ne of the most common areas of misunderstanding in our connected world is the concept of internet speed. We are always hearing about these fantastic super-fast download speeds, yet sometimes it just seems so slow. Is there anything you can do about it?

Well, yes, there is. Data to your home, whether it be by ADSL or cable, is governed by two rates, the one they tell you (downstream) and the one they don't (upstream). Think of it as two hosepipes running into your house, one of them provides water (downstream), and the other one sends out little drops of water to request more pressure from the water company (upstream). When your computer talks to the internet it uses the upstream data pipe to send the requests, and the downstream pipe to receive them.

Now, on an average internet line, the upstream pipe is far thinner than the downstream one, so while you might have lots and lots of available data coming to your home, the part you don't get told about is that everything needs the UPSTREAM

pipe to acknowledge receipt of data. So if you're using too much upstream data, then the downstream will slow to snail's pace regardless of how much you have available.

The solution is to make sure you don't have lots of programs running in the background that uses upstream data. Kids and file sharing programs are the worst culprits. If your internet at home has slowed to a snail's pace, then check that all the devices in the home are not trying to share information upstream with the internet. Many viruses and trojans do this without your knowledge or consent, so it's not always the simplest of tasks, but if you pay attention to your home upstream usage, your speeds will improve drastically.
