As we start our features on local businesses, we start with Louise Oliver, formerly of the Rosemary Conley brand, who has gone solo with her new brand, Slim-Fit. We spoke to her about her business, and what makes her unique in the local fitness world.

he very first thing that strikes you about Louise Oliver is the energy. From the very first second, it is clear that I'm talking to someone who loves what she does.

This brought me to my next question, which was how Slim-Fit can continue to succeed in a world where it's increasingly more convenient to use a games console.

"Well, you can jump

around in your living room following a computer voice, but where's the fun in that? We live in a world where we are increasingly more isolated by our technology and devices. What we do is an escape from that world. What we offer is something that can never be done on a computer, and that's face-to-



face interaction with other people looking to improve their fitness while having fun."

"We all understand what it's like. I was 17 stone at one point in my life, and the thought of going somewhere I could be seen, to get fit, was horrifying. That's why I make sure that Slim-Fit is discreet where it needs to be, and the groups are always laughing and joking around."

I then ask if it's a fitness club or a social club. Louise fires me off a faux-philosophical look and says "It's both."

"Sometimes it's more about the fitness, and sometimes it's just a group of people getting together and escaping the bustle of the modern world. Whatever the reason, we have a lot of fun."

GARDEN

Time To take Stock And Look At Our Planting Schemes

highlight in many gardens is when everything seems to be in full bloom and the garden is alive with wildlife.

As August progresses, more species of butterfly are visible in gardens so we need to plant up our pots, troughs and borders with suitable flowers etc. Long forgotten and old-fashioned cottage garden plants are ideal for this. With their fragrant flowers, in all sorts of shapes and colours.

Colours tend to be very vivid at this time of year, perhaps more so than at other times of the year, so Rudbeckia, Echinacea are two plants I would happily advise to grow as they are very agreeable to many insects that start to form the food chain out there in our wildlife gardens.

This month, August, is ideal to stand back and take stock of our planting schemes. If you are not happy that the colours and types are attracting enough wildlife, plan to add more perennial plants in late autumn and see if we can all extend the flowering season a bit longer.

Leaving some Ivy to flower into the Autumn is a great way of extending the nectar season for the bee's. Ivy doesn't have to mean neglect. Wildlife gardening isn't about doing nothing, its about gardening in a slightly different way.

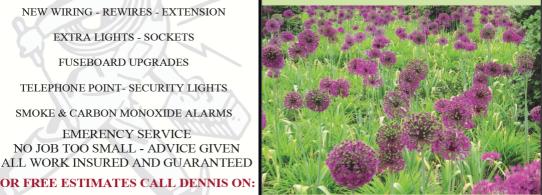

Lessons from 40 lifetimes



henever I find myself in a situation where I am talking about my life, I find myself being reminded that my life up to this point has been quite an adventure.

I've always been told I've lived more than 40 lifetimes' worth of experiences in as many years, and while I don't agree with much of that accusation, I can't deny that I've had some interesting times.

Having been whisked away from my northern English roots at the tender age of 8 years old, and deposited in Zimbabwe, my childhood was very nomadic. My father, being in construction, was constantly moving, so I learned to respect many different cultures I had to assimilate.

Through into adulthood, being an undiagnosed bipolar sufferer, there have been many mishaps, errors in judgement, mistakes and lessons I have learned. And every story is 100% true. Nothing is dramatised or fictionalised.

And the first one I would like to share with you is this:

Lesson 1: Never drink alcohol and tickle a lioness!

Way back in 1992, I was working as a junior foreman on a building site in Gaborone, the capital city of Botswana. I did painting and decorating, working for my father's firm at the time.

As anyone with a background of contract construction will know, construction projects in far away lands can sometimes take years to complete, and the staff normally make the site their residence for the duration of a contract, returning home sporadically to see family and friends.

And so all of the staff on a building site co-exist together in camps, or specially designed chalets, or whatever the flavour is of the time.

In Botswana it was a camp. And the main contractor had paid to set up a 2 year camp in a public area of the Gaborone Lion Park.

The Lion Park itself is a beautiful setting, and apart from Leo spending his nights roaring and making dubious noises, it was very peaceful - after lights out.

One night, after a particularly rowdy party in the

camp, one of the tiling sub-contractors, who was visiting site from his head office, did as was done in those days and consumed enough brandy to tranquilise a small elephant.

I remember the next 5 minutes with a sense of disbelief, amazement, shock and ultimately guffawing laughter.

Frans, the tiler, had, in his inebriated wisdom, decided to stumble, Zombie-like, to the chain-link fence separating us from the wild felines.

It was at this point that one of the lionesses, familiar with human visitors, sidled up the fence, and in a very cat-lik way, rubbed her face into the fence, as if looking for a little tickle on the head.

Frans's biggest mistake of the evening was in obliging the lioness, by sticking his finger through the fence and giving her a good old tickly on the nose.

All seemed to be going brilliantly. The lioness was purring like a (very large) kitten, and lapping up the attention.

A few other curious, yet inebriated, contractors started to gather, and that's where it all went wrong.

Deciding to show off his new status as "Lion Whisperer", Frans turned to the now rather-substantial crowd and said "See, nothing to it. It's just a great big p...".

He never finished the word, because the lioness sensed the moment he wasn't looking, and in a single chomp, removed his finger.

Due to the level of inebriation, he didn't notice the pain until he stuck his hand up and saw what looked like a chicken bone where his left index finger was.

With the nearest hospital 200 miles away, the medics kept him fed with brandy, wrapped his finger in t-shirts and got him to hospital where they completed the amputation, and 2 months later he was back at work.

The punchline, though, is that Frans had the words "LOVE" and "HATE" tattooed on the fingers of each hand. How amusing that the Lion chose to eat the H, leaving his left hand answering the question of what happened to his digit. "ATE"

RECIPE

Vanilla Creme Brûlée With Banana Topping.

This classic French dessert is great for dinner parties, housewarmings, or even just a delicious sweet to finish dinner off with. You can't really go wrong with this, they look lovely, and it's not unusual to have people wanting to know where they can get more!

This recipe makes 4 ramekins.

To make, you will need...

- 5 Eaa Yolks
- 75g Caster Sugar (Keep at least 2 teaspons aside for topping)
 - 50ml Milk
 - 450ml Double Cream
 - 1 Whole Banana
 - A few drops of Vanilla extract

To begin, preheat your oven to Gas 2/150C/300F. If you haven't done so already, separate your egg yolks from the egg whites.

A great method of doing this is, using a bowl, crack the egg open so you have two halves and use the shells to pour the yolk from one to the other until all the egg white has drained into the bowl underneath.

Tip the remaining egg yolks into a large baking bowl. You can freeze the leftover egg whites to be used in another recipe if you so desire.

Once all 5 yolks are in your baking bowl, add the caster sugar and whisk until well combined. Set this aside for now, and start with the second half of the recipe.

In a large pan on a medium heat and add the milk and double cream. Stir gently together until the mixture comes to a light simmer. Add the vanilla extract and continue to stir a little more. Once satisfied with the blend, pour it into the baking bowl with the sugar and egg yolks and stir for a minute or two, until the sugar has dissolved completely.

Spoon the mixture evenly into each of the ramekins and carefully place them in a deep oven tray. Fill the tray with boiling water until it comes halfway up the ramekins. This method is called





bain-marie.

Making sure not to get any of the water into your ramekins, carefully place the tray into the preheated oven

Leave to cook for 30-35 minutes until your creme brûlée comes to a more solid and slightly wobbly consistency. When you have achieved this, remove from the oven tray and leave to cool for a few minutes. Top your mini creme brûlées with slices of banana and a few sprinkles of sugar, then transfer to the fridge where, if you're not serving immediately, they can be left to cool and set for an hour or two.

Finally, to complete your little works of art, caramelise the sugar on the tops of the brûlée, using a miniature blowtorch finely over the surface until it becomes dark brown and crunchy. This can be repeated using more layers of sugar, depending on how much crunch you want your desserts to have.

Now all you have to do is serve and enjoy!

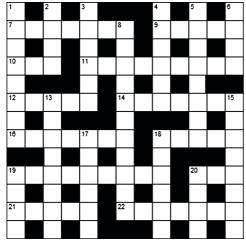
