

Poald Dahl Day is celebrated on September 13th to mark the birth of one of Britain's most famous children's writers. Dahl was born in Llandaff near Cardiff in 1916. The son of Norwegian parents, he was named after Roald Amunsden, a polar explorer from Norway.

It is humour and captivating characters that make Dahl one of the most popular British authors ever. Many of the characters and story lines in his books are based on his own life experiences. For example he was caned as a child for putting a mouse in a jar of gobstoppers in a sweet shop and later wrote Everlasting Gobstoppers. Charlie and the Chocolate Factory his third book stems from his days at Repton School where the boys were often asked to test new chocolates from the Cadbury factory. It is said he dreamed of inventing a chocolate that would impress Mr Cadbury.

When he left school Dahl worked for Shell until in 1939 he entered the RAF. He took part in several significant World War II air battles, and later worked for the British Embassy in Washington. Many of his stories have links to aviation. His first book The Gremlins which was published in 1942, is based on mischievous creatures who were part of RAF folklore. He left the service in 1946 having obtained the rank of Squadron

Leader.

Dahl's children's books are told from the child's point of view and usually include an adult villain who hates or mistreats children. It is thought that this is a link back to his own unhappy days at boarding school. Frequently his books feature 'fat' characters too, black humour and grotesque scenarios. In addition to his children's books Dahl also wrote children's poetry, and it is often forgotten that he wrote adult fiction too. Some of his short stories were the base for the popular television series Tales of the Unexpected.

It will always be his children's books that he is most famous for. Year after year children dress as his characters for world book day, and teachers plan lessons around his stories because of their popularity.

Reading remains so important for building children's vocabulary, and for helping to stimulate their imagination and literacy skills. Dahl's books are often the books adults recount as their favourites while growing-up, or the stories that really captivated them and got them into the reading habit.

A variety of awards and commemorations have been set up since Dahl's death in 1990, and new readers continue to discover his books through new creations such as the Scratch 'n' Sniff version of The Twits which was released in June 2015.

eople really come alive at this time of year especially with the lighter evenings; the birds will be singing strongly, filling the air giving your wildlife gardens a tuneful vibe. You may even get new life appearing in the form of frog spawn. Get out and enjoy it.

As long as it's a few degrees above freezing there's always a chance to catch a glimpse of the first bumblebee of the year and even a few butterflies on the wing, but now it's really warming up that's a daily occurrence, or should be! When reliable warmth does occur, nature often explodes rather than stirs.

This coming year, try buying in less food for the birds and start 'growing' your own. Try sowing a 'Cornfield mix' this year and see if the birds respond.

It should provide you with a blaze

of colour if the seed mix includes field poppy, cornflower, corn marigold and corncockle, and cereal seeds too wheat, barley, you know the sort of thing.

Don't be fooled, it won't be a wildflower meadow, which ALWAYS includes grasses and mainly perennial flowers growing on poor soil. A Corn Field mix is what many of our arable fields would have looked in the old days, prior to herbicides designed to strip out most of the annual flowers.

Have a go, if you ground is fertile you should be onto a winner. Share your photos of your successes and failures, we can all learn from each other on this.





Diagnosing e-mail errors

-mail has become such an integral part of our lives that it's now our primary form of communication, beating the telephone as the most efficient way to stay in touch. But sometimes with email, things go wrong. The most common problems being with receiving or sending messages and your computer's ability to communicate with the server.

At some point, we have all received a message from "Mail Delivery Subsystem" with a bounced email. The problem is, "Mail Delivery Subsystem" seems to assume that everyone is a technical genius, and only gives technical gobbledygook in his emails.

So who is "Mail Delivery Subsystem" and what is his purpose?

Every email server, including the one you use, communicates with other servers in the process of sending email. Imagine it like a sorting office. When you send an email, it goes down your internet line and goes to your provider's server to be processed. Like a local sorting office in the traditional post world. The server then takes your message, looks up the email address, and finds the recipient's server details and asks the recipient's server if the email address is valid. If it is, then the two 'sorting offices' exchange information, and the mail is delivered successfully.

Now, I'm sure you can appreciate that while this entire proces normally takes less than 3 seconds, if there is a weak link in the chain, then "Mail Delivery Subsystem", the "postmaster" of your mail server, will start to process the error.

In the mail that you receive from MDS, you will see a lot of daunting technical information. To diagnose your problem, you need to scroll through the gobbledygook to find a 3 digit code followed by a colon and a message, for example a typical error where servers do not allow messages from senders it doesn't have in a preapproved list is called a "relay" error. The most common of which is code "550: Relaying Denied" - Once you find this code, you will be able to put the code and message into Google and the explanation of what the error is will appear.

This is particularly helpful for people like me, when a customer can say "My email is giving me a 550 error, what do I do?". It's a lot more helpful than "MY email is broken" and allows a support provider to easily identify and resolve a problem, saving time and your support money in the process.

So the next time you get a bounced email, try looking through the message to find the error, look it up, and see how grateful your technician is.




